



EMAIL AUTOMATION OPTIONS

- There are three options you can decide on setting up, depending on several factors that you need to consider.



Inbox Rules (Auto-forwarding)

What does it mean?

- Rules are applied at the individual inbox level, so when you receive an email that fulfills specified condition(s), this will automatically trigger the rule (e.g., forward the email to a specific address).
- You can set this up at the inbox level. Conexiom will be added as a “to” or “cc” recipient.

It is a good option if...

- ✓ All your documents are sent to a centralized inbox(es)
- ✓ You receive ONE type of document in this inbox
 - ✗ If you receive more than one (e.g., you receive POs, and RFQs to the same email) this option is not suitable.

This option allows you to automatically forward your orders once they hit your inbox

Mail Server Rules

What does it mean?

- Rules are set up and applied at your organization level (before the inbox level). This means that rules take action on messages *while they're in transit*, and not after the message is delivered to the mailbox.
- Depending on your email provider, you can set this up in your company's email server level. Conexiom will be added as a “to” or “cc” recipient.

It is a good option if...

- ✓ Your documents are sent to a centralized inbox(es)
- ✓ You receive ONE type of document in this inbox
- ✓ Provides some additional options beyond just forwarding (e.g., Append a value to the subject line so the user can see it went to Conexiom)

This option contains a richer set of conditions, exceptions, and actions other than forwarding



What are my next steps?
